About Our Work

One of the greatest challenges related to carbon monoxide safety is that the surveillance data collected on carbon monoxide injuries and deaths is fragmented and incomplete.

There is no national surveillance system that specifically monitors carbon monoxide poisoning, resulting in significant underreporting of deaths and injuries in the US. We must improve data collection and analysis of carbon monoxide poisoning in order to effectively advocate for change.

This working group will review existing data sources, make recommendations for changes to the reporting systems, and conduct or support independent research on carbon monoxide poisoning prevalence. Our goal for the first year is to support research on the prevalence of carbon monoxide poisoning.
